The **Donut Ride** is perfect ride for beginners, families, and experienced cyclists who want a chance to socialize and meet other cyclists. The group bike ride leaves the Will Rogers Park tennis court parking lot as a group at 9:04 a.m. (not 9:00 a.m. or even 9:05 a.m.) every Saturday morning year round. Experienced leaders guide the cyclists on a slow-paced tour along tree-lined residential streets past the stately old homes in Mesta Park. Cyclists will ride about 5.5 miles to Brown's Bakery in downtown Oklahoma City, break for a donut, and then return via a different scenic route. This is a no-drop ride, meaning no one will get left behind, so no worries if you are slow!

Another ride to tailored to beginners and all riders looking for a leisurely mid-week ride is the Wednesday night ride at Route 66 Park on the west side of Lake Overholser at NW 23rd Street. There are several groups leaving from this location at different distances and speeds, so if you are new to the ride make sure to ask someone about the "around-the-lake" leisure group to make sure you don't head out with the "racers" The ride leaves the park promptly at 6:00 PM. This ride is active April through October only.
